Organize a team.



Taking action is often a community effort. As a union, it's essential that we affirm our collective strength and power to governments, administrators and the public. If there's an issue you care about, get involved and fight for it. The action process doesn't happen overnight, but you can start by reaching out to the support systems in place: your Bargaining Unit and your Local.

When we organize together, we win. History has shown how powerful we can be when we collectively fight at the local level for the things that matter. This unity is how we build our grassroots movement.

It's important to work closely with your Local leaders and use their support to engage other members in any action that you help organize. Here's how you can get started:

- 1 Contact your Bargaining Unit President to find out how you can get involved and let them know you are ready to organize local action.
- 2 Volunteer to help plan the next action, whether it is for a provincial, local or Bargaining Unit campaign.
