

Guide to Voting in the 2025 Federal Election

Election Day - Monday, April 28, 2025

Am I Eligible to Vote?

You are eligible to vote in the 2025 federal election if you are:

- Be at least 18 years old and
- Have Canadian citizenship

How Do I Register to Vote?

Please visit [Voter Registration – Elections Canada](#) to confirm, update or add your information to the voters list by **April 22, 2025**.

You will need one piece of identification that has your name and current residential address to update or add information.

How To Vote

There are many ways to vote in the upcoming federal election including:

- On election day – at the voting location assigned to you based on your current address. To find your polling station on election day, check your voter information card or use Elections Canada's [Voter Information Service tool](#).
- At any Elections Canada office (**until Tuesday, April 22, 2025**). Find the addresses of Elections Canada offices [here](#).
- At an advance voting location – Advance polling stations are open from **April 18, 2025, to April 21, 2025**, for four days, from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. You can vote at any of the advance voting locations in your electoral district. Find the location closest to you [here](#).
- By mail – complete a [Vote by Mail application](#) by **Tuesday, April 22, 2025, by 6:00 pm** and provide a copy of at least one government-issued ID.
- If you're a student – you can also [Vote on Campus](#). There are approximately 120 campuses participating in the Vote on Campus program. Find the list of participating institutions [here](#).

What should I bring to vote?

Option 1: If you have a voter information card, you need to show **one** piece of ID with your name on it.

Option 2: If you **do not** have a voter information card, you need to **show two pieces of ID**. Both must have your name and at least one must have your current address.

Why should I vote?

On Tuesday, April 28, 2025, you have the power to choose better. We do not have to choose between bad and worse. Let’s elect a federal government that will improve access to our public health care. Imagine a health-care system where everyone has access to timely, high-quality public care. One with enough nurses and health-care workers to provide the care you need and deserve, close to home.

Our federal government has the ability and responsibility to make this a reality. But it’s no secret that underfunding and staffing shortages are resulting in longer wait times, service cuts and closures. Nurses and health-care workers are struggling with an endless cycle of unsafe staffing, violence, and burnout – and many are looking for the exit.

Meanwhile, private corporations are looking to take advantage of the situation by profiting off our health care. For-profit health care hurts access for average people, provides worse care and costs more. Instead of giving our taxpayer dollars to private corporations, we need a federal government that will ensure our public health care is fully funded so people get the care they need when they need it. Vote with nurses to fix the nursing shortage, fully fund health care, and expand pharmacare to cover all prescription drugs.

Key Dates

- Advance Voting Days: **April 18, 2025, through to April 21, 2025**, for four days, from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. You can vote at any of the advance voting locations in your electoral district. Find the location closest to you [here](#).
- Election Day: **On April 28, 2025**. Vote at your assigned polling station from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm (EST). To find your polling station on election day, check your voter information card or use Elections Canada’s [Voter Information Service tool](#).
