



The City of Belleville gave nearly \$1 million in additional funding to Hastings & Prince Edward Public Health (HPEPH).

Why is HPEPH refusing to pay public health nurses wages that keep up with inflation?

Over 50 public health nurses who provide care to almost 200,000 residents in Hastings and Prince Edward Counties are fighting for a fair contract, which includes wage increases to keep up with the cost of living and inflation. Recently, Ontario's hospital-sector nurses received 11% wage increases over 2 years, yet public health nurses in Hastings and Prince Edward Counties are being left behind.

HPEPH has left nurses no choice but to take job action if they do not get a fair contract. This would result in **disruption of public health services** including immunization clinics, sexual health clinics, breastfeeding consultations and mental health supports.

Better wages for public health nurses at Hastings & Prince Edward Public Health will mean better care for our community.
